

CV Anđa Radonjić

Dr. Anđa Radonjić is an associate professor at the University of Belgrade, Faculty of Agriculture (Department of Phytomedicine, Chair of Entomology and Agricultural Zoology). She obtained her BSc in Plant Protection in 2000 and her PhD in Entomology in 2012, both from the Faculty of Agriculture at the University of Belgrade. Dr. Radonjić has been employed at the Faculty of Agriculture since 2002, first as a teaching and research assistant, and later as an assistant professor and associate professor. In 2008, she was awarded a scholarship from the Swedish Institute (SI) and spent six months at the Swedish University of Agricultural Sciences in Uppsala, Sweden. During 2013 - 2014, she spent a year as a postdoctoral researcher at the same institution. An expert entomologist, Dr. Radonjić specializes in aphid ecology and biology, with her research focusing on aphids as vectors of plant viruses. Her work also examines the behavior of aphids, predatory ladybirds, and storage insects in response to volatile compounds. Dr. Radonjić is author of over 110 scientific publications, including 22 peer-reviewed papers in international journals. Eight of them were published in leading journals ranked in the top 30% in the JCR list. Their work has been cited 283 times (254 times excluding self-citations) and their H-index is 9 according to Scopus. She has participated in 11 national and international research projects. So far, she has been involved in 7 PhD theses, and was a mentor for 3 PhD students and 10 MSc students. In 2021, she received the AGRIF Award for the best scientific paper in the field of agriculture. Dr. Radonjić has contributed to the organization of five national symposia as a member of the organizing or scientific committees. She is also a member of the Steering Committee of the Entomological Society of Serbia and a member of the editorial board of the journal Plant Doctor. Dr. Radonjić is married and mother of one child.
